Invitation to the Newcastle 2017 Symposium on Microgrids

On behalf of the International Microgrid Symposium Steering Committee and the Newcastle Local Organising Committee, we invite you to the thirteenth in our series of microgrid symposiums at Newcastle, Australia, on **29-30 November 2017**. As a microgrid expert, we value your participation in discussions on current and future microgrid and related smart grid research, development and demonstration activities. Note that participation in these symposiums is by invitation only, and since interest is increasing, please carefully follow the reservation process set out below. Subject to availability, the final day to register is **31 August 2017**. If you need a visa to visit Australia, please see the instructions under **Visas** below.

The purpose of these events is to exchange information internationally, yet informally, on the current state of research on microgrids, and to identify key technical, economic and policy issues that should be addressed by future work. Our goal for the Newcastle 2017 Symposium on Microgrids is to continue our exchange of results from microgrid research, demonstration and deployment worldwide with an emphasis on recent results and areas of potential international co-operation. As before, each region will invite speakers to present their work, and there will be

additional short summaries of the region's research program. In addition to these prepared presentations, group discussion will be encouraged.

Symposium Arrangements

The format of the Newcastle Symposium will be similar to prior ones. Attendance is by invitation only and attendees, including speakers, are responsible for their own travel and accommodation expenses. As in past years, we will endeavour to finance the Symposium without a registration fee, although some fees may be charged for conference events and tours. We aim for an attendance of approximately 120. If your organisation would like to become a sponsor for the symposium, please contact a local organising committee member shown on the last page.

The Symposium will be held at the CSIRO Energy Centre, Newcastle, New South Wales, on Wednesday and Thursday 29-30 November 2017. The Symposium dates have been chosen to connect to the 7th Innovative Smart Grid Technologies (ISGT Asia 2017) IEEE-PES conference to be held in Auckland, New Zealand, on 4-7 December 2017 (http://sites.ieee.org/isgt-asia-2017/). At least one post-symposium tour of an Australian microgrid demonstration will be available on Friday 1 December 2017.

Welcome reception

A welcome reception will be held at the CSIRO Energy Centre on the evening of 28 November. The reception will include tours of the CSIRO site, commencing at 4pm (subject to change), followed by a cocktail function.

Poster Session

The Symposium will include a poster session. Posters can have multiple authors, and typically we like to see developments fostered by an active microgrid research team. Attendees who wish to present on behalf of their team are invited to submit a one-page abstract to newcastle@microgrid-symposiums.org.

The abstract should describe the poster's objectives and main contribution(s) to microgrid research. The Publications Committee will review the abstracts and notify accepted poster authors regarding final submission and poster presentation. An electronic version of the poster to be included in the proceedings will be required prior to the Symposium.

The important poster deadlines are as follows:

abstract submission: 1 September 2017
notification of poster acceptance: 15 September 2017
submission of final electronic version: 1 November 2017

Poster presenters are responsible for printing their posters and bringing them to the Symposium. Posters must be in English, and the suggested size is A0, or roughly 84 cm (33 inches) by 119 cm (47 inches), portrait format. Please consider that the posters will appear on the http://microgrid-symposiums.org/ website, and you can see examples of past accepted posters there. The Publications Committee will invite the authors of the best posters and presentations to submit extended versions in paper format to be included in upcoming issues of journals or magazines.

We hope you will be able to join us in Newcastle and help us continue our highly productive microgrid symposium series. We look forward to seeing you there.
